

## Case-Based Teaching in Business Education

<b>Course Title</b>	<b>Case-Based Teaching in Business Education</b>
<b>Course Length</b>	Two half days
<b>Target Audience</b>	Young business faculty members who want to make their classes far more interactive and exciting for students by using case-based pedagogy.
<b>Language of Instruction</b>	English

<b>Course Description</b>
<p>Business cases are increasingly used by business faculty members across the world to bring real-world experiences to their classes and to develop critical managerial skills in their students. The students typically find case classes engaging and stimulating, leading to better learning of knowledge and skills needed by practising managers. Faculty members find the class sessions satisfying and interesting learning experiences. However, a poorly managed case class can easily become a disaster for the students and instructor. Consequently, it is essential for aspiring case teachers to fully understand the philosophy behind this pedagogy and its strengths and weaknesses. This workshop aims to provide faculty members with first-hand experience in learning both the philosophy and the methodology of teaching by the case method. While the workshop's primary focus will be on case-based teaching, an introduction to case writing will also be provided to enrich participant's understanding of the pedagogy. The experience thus gained would impart to faculty members the knowledge, skills, and confidence needed to initiate the use of business cases in their classes.</p>
